The growth rates are higher in Gujarat and Delhi as compared to Bihar and Uttar Pradesh. Nearly half of the population doesn't have proper shelter, access to a decent sanitation system, villages do not have a nearby water source, and villages also do not have a secondary school and lack of proper roads. Some sections of the society like the Dalits are not even included in poverty list maintained by the concerned authorities assigned by the government. They are groups that are marginalized in the society. The element which further complicates and deteriorates the situation is government subsidies system which has leakages in the distribution system. They never reach the households.
